Links to policy - needs work indicators

In their evidence submission the learner **makes no reference to** any of the following:

- the last inspection report for their workplace.



Links to policy – satisfactory indicators

In their evidence submission the learner **mentions** at least one of the following **and why it is relevant** to what they have just learned about:

- their workplace polices or procedures
- relevant legislation on the topic
- national guidance or strategies
- the SSSC Codes of Practice
- the Health and Social Care Standards
- the last inspection report for their workplace.



Links to policy – exceptional indicators

- Learner explains how they will used the policy mentioned to deliver significant improvements to their own practice.
- Learner identifies something they can do to improve outcomes for people using their service and is clear about how they will achieve this.
- Learner identifies improvements needed to their workplace policies and procedures as a result of what they have learned. They need to take responsibility for progressing these improvements.
